The Pastor's Page

Dear Friends:

Last week, we used the term "substance" to explain the mystery of the Eucharist. We remember that this word is the answer to the question: What is that? When applied to the Christian notion of the Trinity, we say that there is one divine "whatness," i.e., God. But when we say that there are three "Persons" in one God, we must clarify what we mean by that term. A "person" is an "individual being of a rational nature." And so, the Father is God but not the Son, the Son is God but not the Spirit, the Spirit is God but not the Father. Moreover, Catholics explain that there are real "relations" within God. Keep in mind that the divine relationships exist from all eternity, in which categories of

time, space, cause, and effect do not apply. Therefore, we do not believe that there was ever a "before" or "after" any of the Persons "came into being," nor were any of the Persons "created." Rather, from eternity the Father generates the Son, and

so His relation to the Son is one of "paternity," while the Son's relationship to the Father is one of "filiation." The Holy Spirit originates from what we call the "double spiration" of the Father and the Son, and His relation to them is called "procession."

While any formulation about God always falls short, the Church developed its understanding to serve a number of important theological principles. One of these is the concept of "monotheism": the Trinity are not "three gods" but one; "equality of greatness": inasmuch as all the Persons partake of the divine nature, they are God to the same (infinite) extent, and no one is the cause or effect of the other; by so teaching, the Church also rejects "modalism," the heresy that denies the distinction between the divine Persons, and holds that the one

Person reveals Himself according to separate "modes": e.g., Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier.

In view of all this, we might well ask what the Trinity, the central dogma of Catholicism, has to do with the price of raisins! The great St. Augustine helps us comprehend the mystery of the Trinity in relatively simple language. He uses two analogies—love, and the workings of the soul—to do so. First, every act of love consists of the one loving, the one loved, and finally, the love. From all eternity, the Holy Trinity is a community of love: the Father loves the Son, who is loved by the Father, with the bond of love that is the Holy Spirit. Moreover, human beings, unlike any other material creature, possess three spiritual powers, by which

we are in the image and likeness of God: the intellect (the seat of knowing), the will (the seat of love), and memory (self awareness). Just as these three powers exist in one soul, so too the divine Persons exist in one God. We human beings, both

individually and collectively, are the mirror of divine life here below. We resort to analogy to penetrate the incomprehensibility of God, but of course, that's what limited creatures must do when faced with the eternal, the absolute.

The practical value of the mystery of the Holy Trinity is that every Catholic family is called to emulate the community of love that is God. Like the fleur-de-lis, with its central and side petals, may we convey through knowledge and love the presence of God in our home, in the Church, and in public life.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY

May 26, 2024 The Most Holy Trinity Sunday

First Reading: Dt 4:32-34, 39-40 Second Reading: Rom 8:14-17

Gospel: Mt 28:16-20

FOCUS: Through baptism we receive our identity as children of God with Christ.

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is central to our Christian faith. We are baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, receiving the Spirit that enables us to call God our Father. Our identity as sons and daughters of God calls us to share in the Son's suffering, so that we might also share in his glory.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: Moses tells the people that the actions of God on their behalf show he is Lord of heaven and earth. Paul tells the Romans that they have received a Spirit of adoption to be children of God and joint heirs with Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the eleven disciples to make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

WHAT IS THE BLESSED TRINITY?


The Blessed Trinity is God! There are three Persons in God, but there is only one God. "Trinity" comes from the Latin word for three.






