**READINGS FOR SUNDAY**  
**June 16, 2024**  
*11th Sunday in Ordinary Time*

First Reading: Ez 17:22-24  
 Second Reading: 2 Cor 5:6-10  
 Gospel: Mk 4:26-34

**FOCUS:** The seeds of God's kingdom are planted but not yet full-grown.

Jesus uses the images of the sower and the mustard seed to explain the kingdom of God. Although seemingly small or insignificant, these examples demonstrate that great things can happen through the work of God. The kingdom must grow to become like Ezekiel's lofty cedar tree, which is full of the fruits of the kingdom. All our efforts in building the kingdom, even if they seem small, will be blessed by God.

**LITURGY OF THE WORD:** Ezekiel speaks for the Lord God, saying he will plant a majestic cedar on the mountain of Israel. Paul writes that we walk by faith, not by sight, and we must appear before the judgment seat of Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus likens the kingdom of God to a man who scatters seed and harvests it when it is ripe, and also compares the kingdom to a mustard seed that grows into a large plant.

## The Pastor's Page

Dear Friends:

One of the great joys here at St. Mary's is to spend time with the children of our parish. Whether at Religious Education, or celebrating their first confession, communion, or confirmation, or greeting them after Sunday Mass, I often marvel at the closeness, the warmth, the unspoken devotion between our parents and their children. While I'm sure that a parent's life is not without its frustrations, the rewards of family life far exceed the price one pays.

For Father's Day, I thought it beneficial to take a random survey of the thoughts of the saints who were fathers of families. Could these men pass on their wisdom to our culture today and, in particular, to our fathers? I believe so.

If we agree with the logic, "First comes love, then comes marriage," then it follows that the first and greatest gift fathers give to their children is...to love their wives, the mothers of their children. By putting the happiness of their spouses first, fathers cannot help but teach their daughters what to look for in a husband, and their sons, how to treat their future wives. St. Louis Martin, the father of St. Therese of Lisieux, wrote the following to his bride, Azelie Guerin, the day before their wedding: "Soon we will have the intimate happiness of the family, and it's the beauty that brings us closer to Him." To see in loving his wife the path that brings a man to God—not naively, but in a realistic, mature manner—is to lay a rock-like foundation for the family, and secure the safety and well-being of their children.

As pastor, I see in the eyes of fathers—especially

new fathers—the wonder of having welcomed new life into the world. Blessed Frederic Ozanam, the brilliant academic and founder of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, wrote the following to his friend after the birth of his daughter: "After so many favors that were set down in my vocation in this world, a new blessing has come to me, to know the greatest joy it is possible to experience here below: I am a father!" So often we get caught up in the details of family life that we forget to take the time to savor the sheer joy of fatherhood. Whatever one's achievements, or wealth, or fame may be, they pale beside the divine gift of children.

We also know that parenthood is not merely the act of bringing children into the world, but of ensuring that they develop physically, mentally, and spiritually. On the subject of education, we remember St. Thomas More, the Chancellor of England who stood up to King Henry VIII in defense of marriage. He writes: "The many great gardens of the world, of literature and poetry, of painting and music, of religion and architecture, all make the point as clear as possible: The soul cannot thrive in the absence of a garden. If you don't want paradise, you are not human; and if you are not human, you don't have a soul." Thomas believed that all of his five children, including his four daughters, should be given a generous education as their right and responsibility. Besides the practical benefits that accrue to it, education prevents the tragic consequences of crime and societal disorder that spring from ignorance.

Finally, our end as Catholics is not merely to attain worldly happiness, but our eternal goal, namely, eternal life with God. Our every judgment, word, and action should be judged on the degree to which

these conform and contribute to that ultimate purpose. St. King Louis IX wrote the following to his son, who became Philip III: “Therefore, dear son, the first thing I advise is that you fix your whole heart upon God, and love Him with all your strength, for without this no one can be saved or be of any worth.”

Of course, we cannot forget St. Joseph, the foster father of Our Lord, as the model of fathers. Although none of his words have been recorded, his actions speak far more eloquently. Despite its unique circumstances, Joseph’s marriage to our Blessed Mother was “true” in two ways. First, by God’s grace, it resulted in the perfection of both spouses; their respective examples of holiness are more than sufficient evidence of this. Moreover, their marriage resulted in bringing both spouses closer to their goal, namely union with God in Heaven.

Jesus tells us (Mt 6:21): “Where your treasure is, there your heart is also.” These saintly fathers teach their children to find their treasure not in riches, power, and fame—abundant as these may be—but in God above all things, thereby setting them on the path to true, heavenly treasure.

Let us therefore revere our fathers for their steadfast love, their unsung sacrifices, and their selfless generosity, most of which we will never fully comprehend, and know that their good works follow them to the gates of heaven. Happy Fathers’ Day!

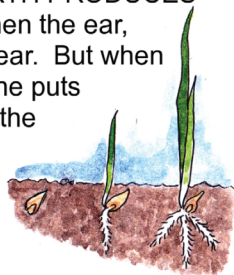

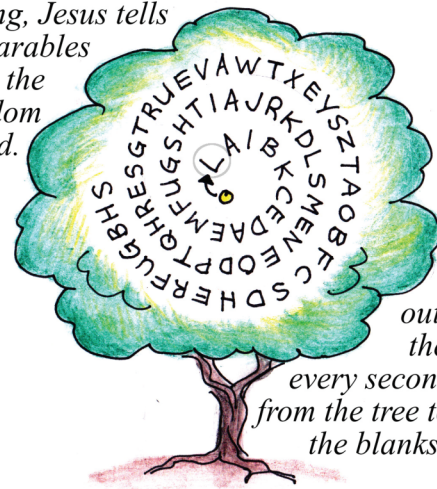


