Please notify the Rectory and Human Concerns Ministries if there is anyone seriously ill so that we can provide spiritual care.



READINGS FOR SUNDAY

August 13, 2023 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: 1 Kgs 19:9a, 11-13a Second Reading: Rom 9:1-5

Gospel: Mt 14:22-23

FOCUS: The Lord is abounding in love and mercy,

but he isn't always "loud."

It was in the tiny, whispering sound that Elijah experienced the Lord's presence. It is a good reminder for us that sometimes God is in the storm, sometimes he is in the whisper, sometimes he is the calming presence walking on the water. His love and mercy abound, and we need simply to keep our eyes on him and reach out our hand when we need help

LITURGY OF THE WORD:

In the first reading, the Lord revealed his presence to Elijah not in great forces of nature but in a tiny whisper. Saint Paul writes of his sorrow in loving his people who do not accept Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus invites Peter to join him in walking on water; Peter does so until he doubts, and Jesus catches him when he begins to sink.

The Pastor's Page

Dear Friends:

"I love humanity; it's people I can't stand." So goes the adaptation of a passage from Dostoevsky's *Brothers Karamazov*. We today run the risk of romanticizing the human condition, while failing to love people in their particularity. Contempt for ordinary people, replete with their imperfections and weaknesses, covers a multitude of sins. It is also antithetical to the mission of Christ, who came that we might have joy, and have it to the full (Jn. 15:11).

This week the Church celebrates the dogma of Our Lady's Assumption into Heaven. Pope Pius XII articulated in 1950 a long-

held conviction of the faithful that Jesus, the most faithful observer of the law, could not help but honor his eternal Father, as well as his beloved Mother. And so, it follows that "on the completion of the course of her earthly life, (Mary) has been taken

up, in body and soul, to the glory of heaven." The saints and apologists of the Church go to great pains to point out what this statement does *not* mean, namely, that somehow the Virgin had divine nature, or some sort of unfair advantage over the rest of us. Indeed, she stands, like us, in need of the salvation her Son brings. But then, what is it that we Catholics acknowledge when we "super-honor" (*hyper doulia*) the Blessed Mother above all the saints?

We get a clue from a work by one of my favorite poets, Gerard Manley Hopkins. He contrasts the uninterrupted change we observe in the material world, and with it the passing of human life, and the effect of Christ's Resurrection:

In a flash, at a trumpet crash,
I am all at once what Christ is,
since he was what I am, and
This Jack, joke, poor potsherd, pat, matchwood,
immortal diamond,
Is immortal diamond.

As a religious thinker, Fr. Hopkins was at once traditional and original. He believed in objective truth, which the human mind can discover rather than "construct." On the other hand, he believed, in contrast to others, that the mind can have genuine knowledge of *particular* things, not just *universal* essences. For instance, one can know, not just what "bird" means, but rather *this* robin, or kingfisher, or thrush. Like-

wise, one knows, not just "man," but rather *This Jack* (my emphasis), which is how the poet refers to his own unique place in God's creation.

Those who read Hopkins' work (e.g., Balthasar) see the Incarnation of Christ, and therefore the role of his Mother, as examples of what Lucy Becket describes as the transcendent God manifesting himself in the humanity of his Only-Begotten Son.

We Christians, who on this side of heaven are imperfect in our reflection of Christ's image, await that transformation into the likeness of Christ because we are confident that we will be like him, who came to be like us. In the meantime, our faith reminds us that God loves each one of us in our unique circumstances, with all the struggle and victory they imply.




